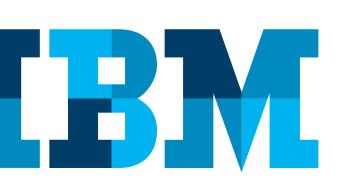

Each year over 650,000 planning applications are submitted to the Department of Communities and Local Government (DCLG). The Department's Planning Portal is provided to be the first port of call for land use planning, building information and online services. It operates at the center of the land use planning process for England and Wales in that it provides services to citizens, businesses and all 398 English and 25 Welsh Local Planning Authorities. The Portal also serves in the resolution of disputes in England and Wales, regarding the use of land, natural resources and the environment dealing with a wide variety of planning-related casework, including listed building consent appeals, advertisement appeals, compulsory purchase orders, rights of way cases and cases arising from the Environmental Protection and Water Acts and the Transport and Works Act.

The **Opportunity**

The DCLG Planning Portal was implemented in 2002 to champion the electronic delivery of planning services, enabling the department to cut public costs, reduce fragmented services, speed processes and offer better end-to-end, consistent service to the wider planning community. As part of this service, the DCLG included tools to support continual improvements to the portal's functionality and usability to increase efficiency and reduce costs.

What Makes It Smarter

The key to encouraging all parts of a community—from citizens to planning professionals—to use online services is to make them simple, user friendly and efficient to use. The Planning Portal uses a web analytics tool to support continual service improvement and year-on-year growth of online transactions. By analyzing user journeys, page hits and many other user interactions on the site, the tool highlights changes

What if a government department could use a web portal as the catalyst to transform its interactions with businesses and citizens? that will improve and simplify journeys through the portal and how key content can be presented to maximize availability. As a result of ongoing improvements, the portal now handles more than 12 million visits, 100 million page views and 70 percent of all planning applications each year, establishing itself as the number one source of information for planning services in the United Kingdom.
